Here are a few things you can be talking about/working on at home...

- Last names: we will be working on identifying and writing our last names
- Sight words: ask your child what sight word they are learning about at school! Explore a few sentences with that sight word in it, help your child pick it out in the books you read at home.
- Continue to talk about our letter of the week and the sound it makes in words
